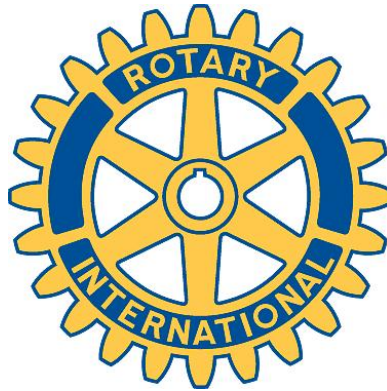

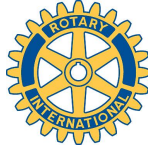

There is a Board meeting Wednesday, February 20th at 11:30 AM in the MCL Restaurant & Bakery. Hope to see all the Board Members there.

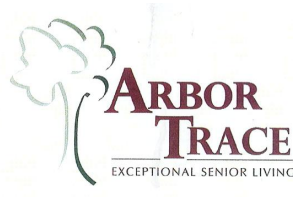
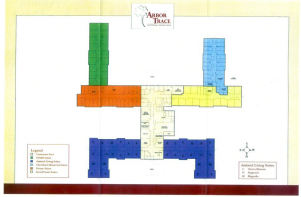
