Vivian Ashmawi addressed the Richmond Rotary Club on 11 March and summarized a number of programs and activities currently in place in Communities in Schools of Wayne County. A total of 8,153 students are potentially involved with CIS.

One of the chief problems being addressed is the fact that Richmond High School has been labeled a 'Dropout Factory' by Johns Hopkins University. Ms. Ashmawi asserted that this designation was intended as an attention getter rather than an insult to the institution.

CIS has many thrusts, including a program which helps teach parents how to read to and with their children. She then read testimonials of several success stories involving children and CIS volunteers and coordinators.

She summarized her presentation by urging awareness, advocacy, and action on the part of all individuals involved in the CIS programs. Story by Joe Kaiser
