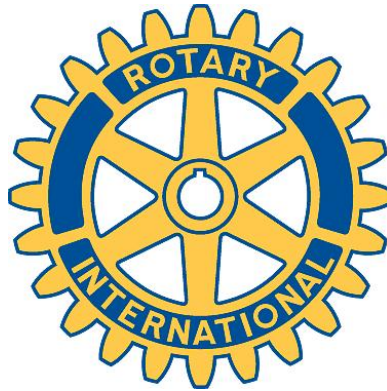

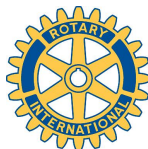

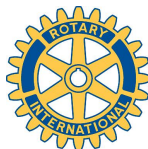

Bridget Hazelbaker spoke last Tuesday about a new service organization in Wayne County called "Mother's Bank." The organization, funded by donations, makes small loans to heads of households who are in need of immediate funding for such expenses as sports fees, registration fees, SAT registration, etc. The monies advanced to the recipients are expected to be repaid, without interest.

The speaker added that 63 per cent of students in RCS are on free or reduced lunch, and that the number of single-parent households is increasing locally.

Advances are awarded in check form to the vendor, not to the parent-in-need. The

Townsend Center director has agreed to assume fiscal involvement of writing checks and maintaining financial records. Eventually, the group would like to be in a position of making loans to mothers who wish to start small businesses.
