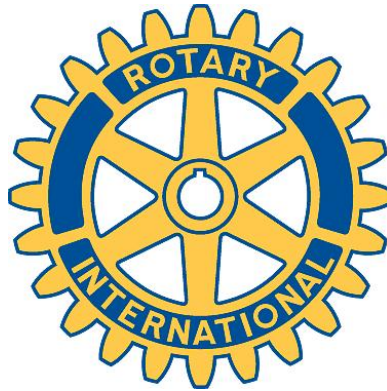

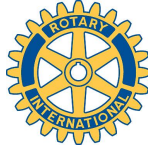

PICT has been working in the schools for the last 22 years and if you knew what they have done you know that they are always working in whatever positive direction is needed.

This year they are implementing the Protecting You Protecting Me (PYPM) program in 3 of the most challenged Richmond elementary schools. PYPM is a five-year, science-based, proven-strategy alcohol and other drug prevention curriculum for grades 1-5 or 2-6.

She shared with us how the PICT peer helpers are trained and how the peers assist those students that are in need of someone to talk to that they can confide in and trust.
