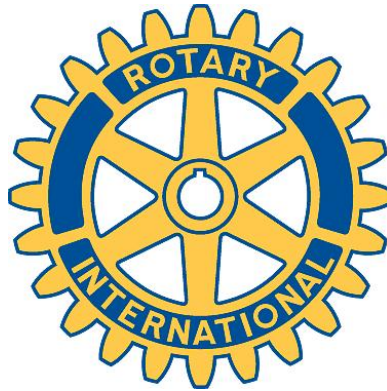

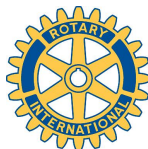

Bring your contribution to the April 15 luncheon or send to Shelley Rhoads before the DG's visit.

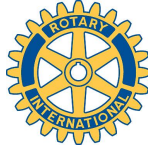

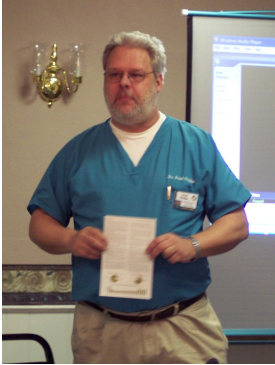

Dr Fred Phillips shared with us information regarding Rotary Ambassador Scholarship Program. Central Indiana Rotarians annually invite outstanding candidates to apply for a Rotary academic year Ambassadorial Scholarship.

At least one scholarship for international study at the advanced undergraduate or graduate level, valued at up to \$26,000, has been awarded each year by our district. The scholarships have been changed to \$23,000 in value by The Rotary Foundation.

Interested parties are urged to carefully review scholarship criteria and requirements on the Rotary International website.

Awards given by Rotary District 6560 are open only to U.S. citizens and Permanent Residents who reside or are students in the geographical limits of Rotary District 6560 in central Indiana.

Ambassadorial Scholars are expected not only to be outstanding scholars but enthusiastic ambassadors for Rotary. Scholars are expected to give presentations to Rotarians while abroad and after returning home.

Nominations must be endorsed by officials of one of the 44 Rotary clubs in central Indiana.

Information about the scholarships and the application process will be available and sent to club presidents in January.

Clubs should recruit qualified applicants and submit applications in the 1st of the year. Interviews are traditionally scheduled for late April or early May.
