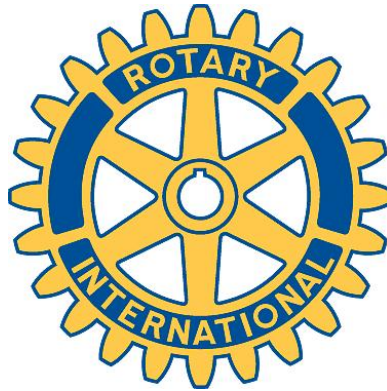

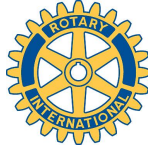

Last Tuesday Renee Oldham discussed several issues before the agency she heads, City Center Linkages, formerly Main Street. She explained the various uses of the former Osco store, now the Innovation Center. There, assistance has been given fifteen companies commencing new local businesses. However, she pointed out that forty-five business ideas were rejected because their concepts had not been thoroughly thought through, their financing was inadequate, or plans were too sketchy. In addition eight classes given by Indiana Wesleyan University are offered at the Center each week. She singled out Rotarian Tim Lloyd, who, along with other business leaders, allowed use of his businesses' vehicles and employees to travel to Indianapolis and bring to Richmond the Christmas decorations the capital city donated to Richmond. She cited improved occupancy in the Main Street corridor.

The City Center concept is to include the Gorge, the Depot District, as well as the Main Street corridor, meshing them together in an effort to expand Richmond's core area. She noted that two new restaurants will be coming to City Center. She concluded by explaining her frustration over the license bureau's re-location from downtown Richmond to an east side shopping center. By Joe Kaiser
