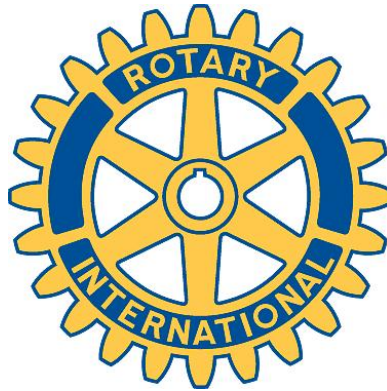

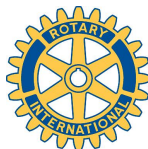

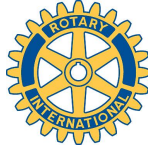

Jodie, Herb, Pat, John and Larry met with District Governor Tom Fisher and Assistant District Governor Max Ward prior to the regular meeting.

Tom talked to us about membership and gave us some ideas as to how we might improve our membership numbers.

At our regular Tuesday meeting District Governor Tom Fisher addressed the club, announcing that the theme for 2008-09 is

Make Dreams Real.

He spoke of the nearly 30,000 children who die per day from hunger, malnutrition, and abuse and the role Rotary is playing in overcoming these causes. He also praised the club for the effort it is making in overcoming illiteracy in the area.

Judge Fisher said the goal of the Richmond club is to gain six new members within the next year, adding that current members should not be reluctant from asking persons to join who may be different from ourselves, i.e., different professions, ages, races, etc.

He said that vocational service throughout the district needs to be strengthened and that, in doing so, ethics needs to be the foundation. In addition, he suggested that the club investigate various grants available for programs and that we consider partnering with various other groups in conducting fund raisers.

The judge cited past successes in eradicating polio but added that the disease still poses a problem in four countries. He would like to see the Richmond club have a program that will address child mortality. But, above all, he added that in doing so we should have fun. jlk
