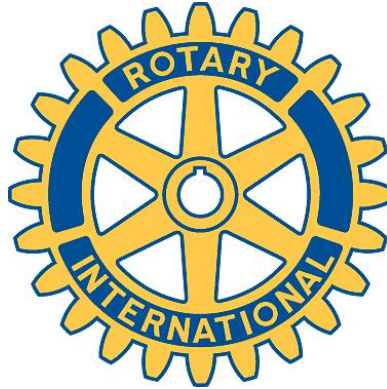

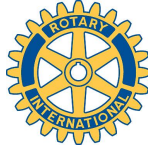

Last Week’s Program:



Maureen Santillo spoke to the Richmond Rotary Club about the Jacy House which opened in September 2003.

The Jacy House is a child-friendly neutral house that is utilized to interview children about abuse and other crimes. The house is owned by Reid Hospital, but allows the organization to board there rent free.

Maureen works as an advocate and interviews the children while police, prosecutors and child services observes from another room. Maureen goes through continuous training learning how to get

information from the children without leading them. Maureen refers to the interviewing portion of their services as “Reactive.”

She also offers “Proactive” services by educating students in grades K-12. These 3 day curriculum-based presentations assists Maureen in helping kids learn to set boundaries when it comes to physical, emotional, and sexual safety. She passes out materials for the students to take home and share with their parents. The classes also help teach the students who “safe people” are and inform them that abuse is never their fault.

The Jacy House is also in the process of holding monthly parent support groups to help educate parents of children who have been abused. It is important for the children to not feel victimized after abuse occurs.

The Jacy House has helped over 1000 children since opening and is an important service in Richmond. JD
