Last Week’s Program:



Rick Ahaus and Louann Moore spoke to the Richmond Rotary Club June 2nd about the Third Grade Academy. Moore, a retired RCS principal took over for Dr. Doering this year as the Educational Director of the program. Mr. Ahaus spoke about the history of Third Grade Academy: In October 2007, the city of Richmond received advice that if 3rd graders were not passing ISTEP or reading at grade level, they are more than likely to drop out prior to graduating high school. In 2008, the Academy had 119 students enroll, and had a 5-1 student-teacher ratio. Out of the 119, 90 of these students “completed” the 19 day (6 hours per day) program. The 90 students averaged a 50% increase on their ISTEP score, but more importantly,

the students changed their attitudes toward learning and reading.

Mr. Ahaus then read a very touching letter from a student who passed their ISTEP test, thanks to the Third Grade Academy.

THIS YEAR: RCS awarded \$100,000 to help fund this year’s academy, and there are already 96 students enrolled. The eligibility for students to enroll has changed from only students failing ISTEP to include students who passed ISTEP by a few points.

This year, Third Grade Academy begins June 29th and will run for 20 days. They have focused on getting teachers who have extensive literacy/reading comprehension training, and are changing the curriculum to include test-taking help. The academy still needs money to complete the program, and anticipates a larger group than last year. Louann Moore has chosen books for the students to read. They will have their own hard back copy of a book, and will begin a new story each week.

Richmond Rotary could possibly purchase these books for the students???? js

MEMBERSHIP -- WE NEED YOUR HELP

1. WHERE ARE WE NOW?

The club seems to be at a stand still or as some view it disappearing.

The club has been active with various projects and has returned the monies back into the community and to Rotary International. This is good, however, with the membership reducing it becomes impossible for a few members to continue to provide the needed time for these ongoing projects.

2. WHERE DO WE WANT TO BE?

One objective that the club could work toward is to get the current attendance back up to at least a 60% - 70% range.

Another is to increase its membership by 100% in three years.

This would equal 24 new members, one new member for each current member bringing the total membership to 48 members by year end June, 2012.

3. How do we get there?

1. A survey of what would it take to get **all** members to attend.
2. What is missing?
3. A survey of all business and professional prospects in and around the Richmond community in order to determine which prospects to consider.
4. We would need a total member effort to participate in a membership drive.

Our goal would be 8 members per year for the 3 year goal.

This would be by the end of the Rotary year, June 30, 2012.

The resources needed would be an oversight committee and all of the current members participation.

We could hold one or two membership social times.

We could invite a known speaker to Richmond and hold a luncheon or dinner to raise funds and hold a membership invite.

We need to create a committee that would be willing to visit prospects and invite them to Rotary.
