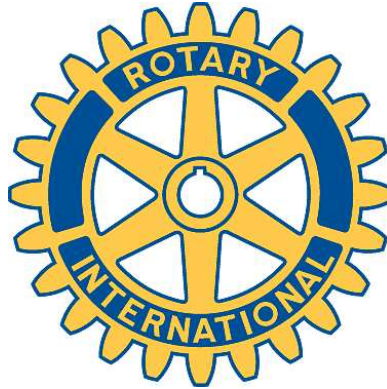

Last Week’s Program:



Rotarians Paul Kriese and Don Bates squared off Tuesday afternoon, participating in a modified debate. The questions being argued were the health care issue and cap and trade.

Paul argued that all Americans, even those incarcerated, deserve health care, stressing that all Americans should participate in government as a political force, because scattered groups with strong beliefs cannot be relied upon to bring about change in

legislation.

Don quoted Presidents Reagan and Clinton, but urged that Medicare and Medicaid should be addressed first and stressed that the plan, as it now stands, is unsatisfactory.

Paul commented that health care should extend to all, including students and the elderly, even though it will be costly to the Federal government.

On the second subject Paul argued that people who pollute should be charged to pay those who do not. Don opposed this plan, adding that the plan should be enforced by government oversight, adding that global warming advocates need to be stopped lest they bankrupt the country.

The two answered questions from the audience. No decision was reach regarding which Rotarian won the debate. JK
