INDIANA STATE MUSEUM FOUNDATION DIRECTOR J. RONALD NEWLIN, ACCOMPANIED BY LINDA MCCABE, ISM DONOR RELATIONS MANAGER, SPOKE TO THE CLUB TUESDAY ABOUT THE MUSEUM AND ITS LONG HISTORY OF TRACING SIGNIFICANT EVENTS IN THE STATE'S SPAN OF NEARLY TWO HUNDRED YEARS.

NOTING THAT IN ADDITION TO THE INDIANAPOLIS SITE, THERE ARE TWELVE OUTREACH LOCATIONS THROUGHOUT THE STATE. LOCATED AT THE WHITEWATER STATE PARK, THE MAIN BUILDING CONSISTS OF 270,000 SQUARE FEET AND IS CONSTRUCTED FROM

MATERIALS INDIGINOUS. HOUSING AN IMAX THEATRE, RESTAURANTS, AND THE HISTORIC PENDULUM, THE MUSEUM HOUSES CULTURAL AND HISTORICAL ARTIFACTS SIGNIFICANT TO THE HOOSIER STATE. OF PARTICULAR INTEREST IS THE NEWLY ACQUIRED LINCOLN COLLECTION, WHICH HAD PREVIOUSLY BEEN HOUSED IN FORT WAYNE. JLK
