June 15th Program – Chris Sitler “Scrabble”



Chris Sitler, pastor of the Dublin, Indiana, Friends Meeting, spoke to the club on the topic of competitive scrabble. He recently finished first in his class in a tournament in Athens, Georgia.

He discussed how he first became interested in scrabble and cautioned club members to think of scrabble as only a word game but to think of it as an aid to spelling, a tool to develop the mind and memory, and of its spatial relationships.

Scrabble can be played on line. Some high schools have scrabble clubs.

After demonstrating how the scrabble board works, he showed the bag of tiles which are used to cover squares on the board. Tiles must be constructed of smooth plastic with no indentations. A game lasts a maximum of twenty-five minutes and a judge is in place to make calls whenever called for. And---the dictionary is not allowed. jlk
