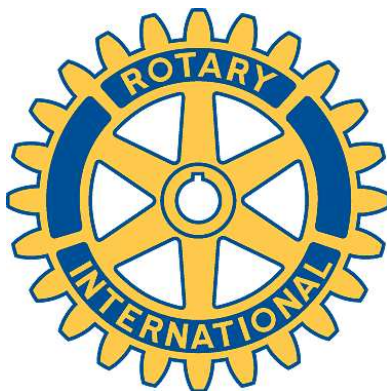

June 29th Program – Tom Branum “Water is Life”



Rotarian Tom Branum, Fishers Rotary Club, Gave a presentation on the “Water is Life” project. He talked about the difference it was making in the lives of the people of Sierra Leone. He said about \$5 (US money) would provide water to a person for a lifetime.

The cost of each well being drilled is around \$4600 each. That includes all of the training to teach the people in the community how to maintain it. The training also includes how to keep things sanitary and overall how to keep bacteria from causing sickness.

The club presented a check for \$620 for our “International Project” from the proceeds of the Quiz Bowl fundraiser. Tom said that our money

would go a long way to provide water for a community. Using his previously mentioned calculation, we will be providing a lifetime of safe water for about 124 people!! What a great program this is and Tom said he would keep us informed of the progress of the project. af
